


KAYLEE DOYLE

Second Step



This year our district has adopted a social and emotional curriculum called Second Step. This will be used in grades Prek-8. Second Step gives students the tools to excel in and out of the classroom. In the classrooms, students learn valuable skills that help them navigate their way through school as well as their community.

During our first whole school assembly, we learned about self-control during a game led by Mrs. Rieger. Mrs. Confer taught us a fun chant, also!

Along with our Second Step lessons, all students in grades PreK-I2, were introduced to a school wide expectations

matrix. I have been so proud of our elementary students who have quickly recognized how to make our building be amazing! Our motto at the elementary school is simply "Be safe! Be Responsible! Be Respectful!"

Emergency Preparedness

Tornado, fire, and crisis drills will be practiced routinely so students will be prepared to move to areas of safety in the event of a real emergency without panic. By law, all Kansas school districts are required to complete four fire drills, three tornado drills, and nine crisis drills throughout the year.

We had our first "crisis" drill on Thursday, August 23, in each classroom. USD 297 will be using the ALICE model during an active shooter crisis. ALICE stands for alert, lockdown, inform, counter, and evacuate. Our goal is to have our kids prepared and not scared. Therefore, each classroom read the book <u>I'm Not Scared</u>, <u>I'm Prepared</u>, during our drill. This opened some good discussion, which will lead into our drills throughout the remainder of the school year.
