


We welcome our new students to our school!

Second Step will be used again this year. This is a social and emotional curriculum used in grades K-8. During our whole school assembly last week, Mrs. Queen and Mrs. Rodriguez reviewed our bucket filler system and encouraged all students to "Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible". Second Step gives students the tools to excel in and out of the classroom. In the classrooms, students learn valuable skills that help them

navigate their way through school as well as their community.



Tornado, fire, and crisis drills will be practiced routinely so students will be prepared to move to areas of safety in the event of a real emergency without panic. By law, all KS school districts are required to complete two tornado drills, four fire drills, and three crisis drills throughout the year.

In the event of an active shooter crisis, USD 297 will use the ALICE model. ALICE stands for alert, lockdown, inform, counter, and evacuate. Our goal is to have kids prepared, not scared. Therefore, each classroom will use the book <u>I'm Not Scared</u>, <u>I'm Prepared</u> during our drills.
