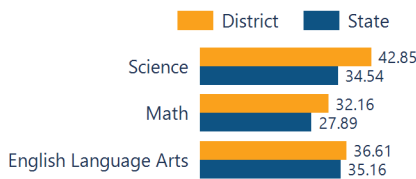

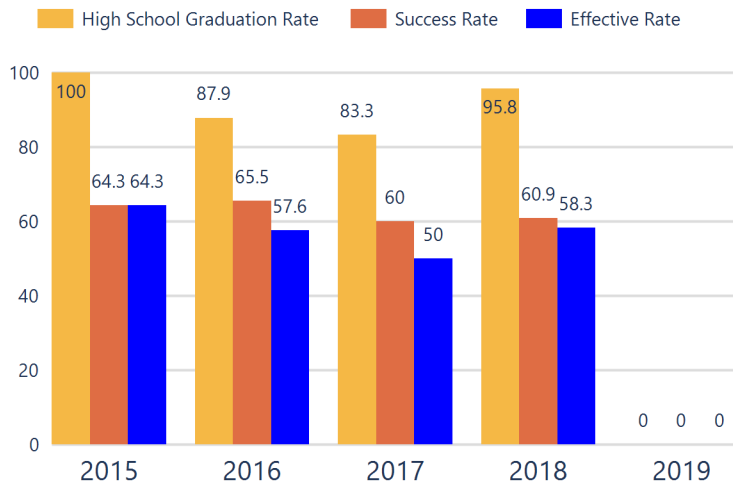
The percentage of students who scored at Levels 3 and 4 on the state assessment.

 - Student earned an Industry Recognized Certification while in High School.
 - Student earned a Postsecondary Certificate.
 - Student earned a Postsecondary Degree.
 - Student enrolled in Postsecondary in both the first and second year following High School graduation.
- Effective Rate:** The calculated Graduation Rate multiplied by the calculated Success Rate.

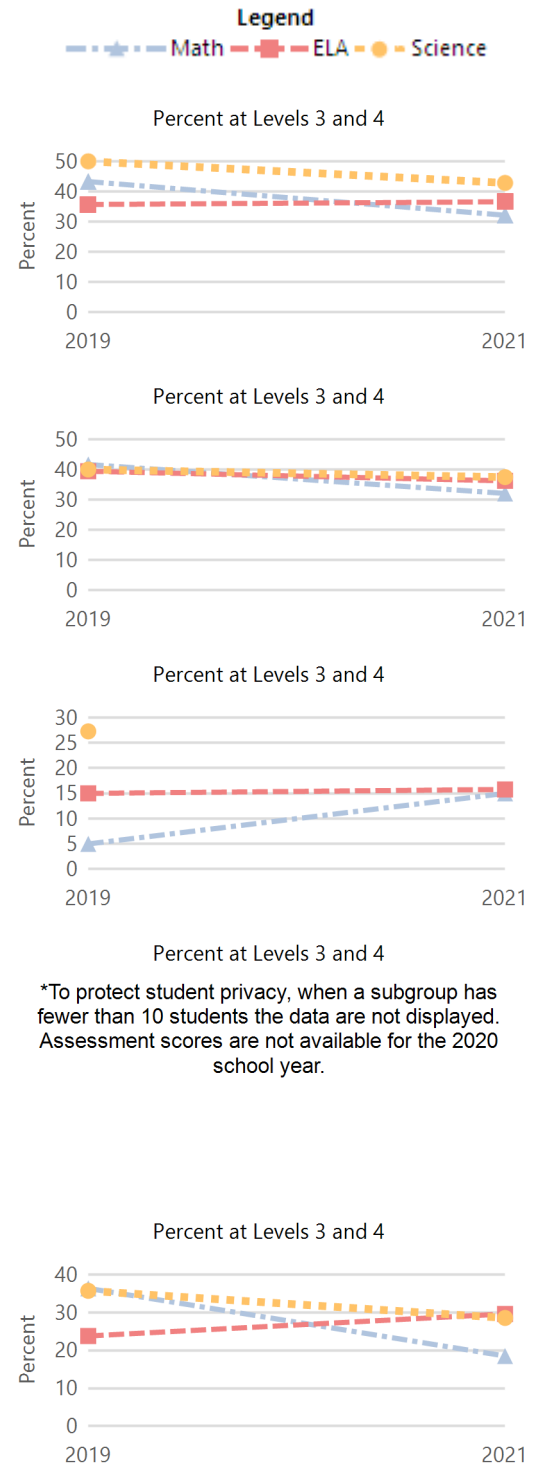
ACT Performance (2021 School Year)

ACT is a national college admissions exam that includes subject level tests in English, Math, Reading and Science. Students receive scores that range from 1 to 36 on each subject and an overall Composite score.
